Sutter also demonstrated **Robosizer**, also a free program. It resizes images, making them smaller. There are numerous configuration options that control what is resized and to what degree. Read more and download from <a href="http://www.robosizer.com/">http://www.robosizer.com/</a>.

Finally, Ralph showed the difference between two options in Google Chrome; **Relaunch Chrome in Windows 8 Mode** and **Relaunch Chrome on the desktop**. See screenshots <u>here</u>.
