The second part of the main meeting was a great demonstration of the FREE version of **Advanced SystemCare by IOBIT**. This program can be considered CCleaner on steroids as it does a lot, lot more.

The program has a one-click approach to help protect, repair, clean and optimize your PC. Ray demonstrated cleaning the registry and then optimizing the Windows 7 operating system.

The third part of the main meeting was a continued Q & A session with Alan assisted by John Waller. One of comments was disabling your SSID (**S**ervice **S**et **I**Dentifier) when setting up a wireless access point to provide more security. SSID, a 32-character unique identifier attached to the header of packets sent over a WLAN that acts as a password when a mobile device tries to connect to the BSS.

The SSID differentiates one WLAN from another, so all access points and all devices attempting to connect to a specific WLAN must use the same SSID. A device will not be permitted to join the BSS unless it can provide the unique SSID.

Because an SSID can be sniffed in **plain text from a packet** it does not supply any security to the network.
