Don showed some of the great flower pictures from the last Digital Photo SIG meeting. Thanks to Bob Grover, Roger Lyon, Paul Moyer, Bob Styerwalt, and Nancy Vrooman. Don then showed how easy and flexible it is to work with photos in Vista without the need for additional viewing software. Windows XP users don't need to be left out since Microsoft has made available free downloads to "port" similar capabilities to this older system.

We also looked at a few July 4th fireworks photos from Pismo Beach and discussed methods for photographing them.

We then looked at some built-in creative tools and advanced techniques for enhancing your photo experience using PhotoShop Elements version 6. This included making an enhancement and then transferring it from one photo to another without the need to re-do the process. This still maintains the ability to quickly modify the adjustments, if necessary, for the new photo. We talked about utilizing multiple tools to simplify selections. Once a selection is done, it is easy to fix part of a photo without affecting the good portions of the photo.
