Microsoft August Windows Update Issues... All my personal Windows systems and Windows systems that I manage support for had no issues. I was contacted for support on an HP and Dell computer which would not boot due to the August Windows updates.

The solution is simple...

- 1) Have your system and programs on one HDD partition and your data on a second HDD partition.
- 2) Always have a current backup of both these partitions.
- 3) Make sure and backup your system partition (including all partitions needed to boot the OS) a few days before the "second Tuesday of the month" Windows updates or any "out-of-cycle" Windows update.
