General Session Review by Ralph Sutter

John "Free John" Kennedy was the featured speaker at the March 3rd 2013 General Session. Making his presentation via **SKYPE** from Newark, Ohio, Kennedy spoke on "Free and Alternatives to Free Software". He divided software up into ten different groups based on function. These ranged from **operating system** to **productivity software.** In each category, John mentioned the most popular paid program and then offered freeware or open source alternatives.

Despite technical difficulties with intermittent audio, Kennedy delivered a great deal of useful, well organized information in a short period of time.
