# April 16th Digital Photography SIG Review by Nancy Vrooman

Heu Brown showed part of his slide show birthday-tribute for his father's 95<sup>th</sup> birthday and explained some of the challenges involved. Searching through boxes of old photos and scanning was the first huge job. Cleaning up the scanned images (from the 1930's - the earliest photographic images of a handsome young man) was done with PhotoShop Elements. With the help of Paul, Kaye and Don he put together a 20 min. show, with music, to find that Elements will not burn to a DVD. Premiere Elements was required for that. Then to find when playing it on a television, each photo did not display in its entirety. Two very talented and helpful young men at E Digital Memories (553 Higuera/SLO) came up with the solution. The resolution was decreased to 600 x 800 pixels and it played beautifully.

Kaye had downloaded the 30 day free trial of Adobe's PhotoShop Lightroom a week before. The introductory price of \$199 will increase to \$299 at the end of April. Why would you want this product when you already have Elements? Reasons include the very friendly & logical user interface, the speed of the program and optional, easy keyboard commands. Another is the ability to make the adjustments to one photo and have that applied to an entire group. For instance color cast (white balance) may need changing. Or dust cleaned up. It has excellent organizational capability plus a star rating that can be applied to photos. Importantly it will burn to a DVD. What won't it do? Layers, masks, cloning or adding shapes-clip art from Elements library. But the image may be opened in Elements with one click and further work done there. Slide show panning and fading, adding background music, adding a title in the photo are all supported. It will export your final show as a .pdf file. It works with RAW images. It also has the 'curve'. Kaye discovered a couple of helpful Websites for PhotoShop users: free tutorials at RAWWORKFLOW.COM and a daily question fully answered at TIMGREY.COM. Kaye's verdict: "I love it."
