# April 4, 2010 Main Meeting Review by John Waller

Our meeting on April 4, 2010 featured Ted Lester. He gave a talk on Google and its features. For example, he said that what made Google great was that it was: Free, Safe, Useful, and Everywhere. You not only find it on your computer, but on mobile devices as well.

There are two aspects to Google, Non-personalized, and Personalized. The personalize parts are provided by iGoogle. Essentially, iGoogle is what in the old days was called a portal. Its intent is to be your first stop on the Web. Your personal web content can be set up there so everything is in one place.

The features of Google that he talked about were: GMail, Google Alerts, Google Talk, Language tools, and of course Google Maps/Google Earth which are probably some of the hottest aspects of Google. Google Calendar, and Google Docs are web based programs that foreshadow the cloud computing that everyone is talking about.

Google Sites is a Google provided service for creating your own websites. Overall, his presentation was excellent and interesting. This presentation is actually the second part to one he gave us about a year ago.

#### Kaye Raul's Programming Schedule by Kaye Raul

SLO Bytes member Ralph Sutter will be the featured speaker at the May 2nd meeting of SLO Bytes. Sutter will demonstrate the setup and use of the Roku box. The Roku box is a small, inexpensive electronic device that allows you to stream Netflix movies and other similar content from the Internet directly to your television screen without feeding it through a computer.

Ralph will show the steps necessary to connect the Roku box to the Internet and then use it to access movies from his Netflix account. He will also use the Roku box to stream Internet radio through Pandora.

Finally, Sutter will invite questions and commentary from the audience about Roku setup and application.

Alan Raul will moderate his Q & A session from 12:45 PM to 2:00 PM.

Additionally, a second SIG for beginners will run concurrently in another room, offering advice and answering questions on Windows operating systems. This is a small group environment specially suited for the novice user.
