We start with a chance to visit in the break room, meet new members, chat about the past month, and share problems and solutions with each other, in our Coffee/Tea and Cookie Break, with great treats served by our volunteer hosts, Nancy Vrooman, and Peter Stonehewer.

Our club guests were also welcomed by President Ray Miklas, and he suggested that they may want to join SLO Bytes at our sign-in table, by speaking to Bob Mires, our Treasurer and Membership Chairman. Ray announced our club activities, which include the HTML and Linux Special Interest Group meetings. The SIGs are scheduled for the first Monday and Thursday evenings of every month, respectively, at Ralph Sutter's home in Arroyo and at the KCBX Training Center in SLO.

If you have pictures to share on our website, please bring your files on a CD-ROM, thumb-drive or floppy, for download to a laptop at the Treasurer's Table, for transfer to our web host, thanks to Ralph Sutter.

The sign-in table is also the place to checkout software which we can loan from our CD-ROM library. Also, recycle any old ink cartridges which you have saved from your printers - just drop them off at the table for Ray Miklas and Dave Grant to pickup after the meeting.

At 2:30 our featured speaker program was a surprise presentation by one of our own members, Jim Buenrostro, on setting up, configuring and using a WiFi home network. He started with a demonstration setting on up a WiFi network in the meeting hall, followed by a Question and Answer session on WiFi. This was a great opportunity to learn from a real expert on the subject. There were two aspects to Jim's demonstration: the Linksys Router/Hub and the laptop WiFi card. He bought these units on sale at Staples, and opened them in front of us, to illustrate how easy it is to install each of them, and set up a link between them. If we had access to a broadband connection in our main meeting hall, the Linksys router could have completed the connection to the Internet. We did see a weak signal from one of our neighbors, and several members had their laptops in operation for the demo.

Their wireless networking lines include offerings from Linksys, Belkin, and Netgear. The older 802.11B and newer 802.11G standards are available in wireless access points/routers, desktop & notebook cards and adapters, multimedia, print servers, and starter kits. Pricing ranges from about \$25 to \$200 for most devices, with rebates listed for some units, and the best values are on clearance items, near the bottom of the scale.
