Windows 8.1 Preview - A responsive Microsoft...

Windows 8.1 isn't just an OS, it's a lesson in course correction.

Microsoft has shown that it's willing to compromise a bit on its post-PC push to nudge along the desktop diehards.

Some of the new features include:

* Metro is still here but you have the option to boot directly to your Desktop

* Drop-down to reveal all the Apps

* Revamped Start button... New right-click options available and an easy way to shut down the computer

* Internet Explorer 11 - It now includes side-by-side browsing and syncing of favorites, tabs, and settings across all Windows 8.1 devices.

* Windows 8.1 will ship with support for Intel's Connected Standby technology for Haswell, and a revised DPI scaling mechanism that is better suited for driving the high DPI displays that are coming down the pipeline for both Ultrabooks and desktops.

Windows 8.1 should be a welcomed FREE upgrade to be released later this year.
