Program Presentations: by Don Jones

The rapid advance in digital camera technology and a competitive market has made photo and video capabilities available to most of us that were not even imagined only a few years ago. Most cameras now have video capability, and many take movies in High Definition, HD. Many have a large zoom from a relatively wide angle—we'll look at a sample output from a modestly priced pocket-able camera. Now what do we do with all these pictures and videos?

On **September 5th,** we will concentrate on some of the creative ways to have fun and share your creations and prepare them for efficient video editing. The main purpose of these two sessions will be directed toward creating videos from your photos and videos. We will be using the modestly priced yet extremely capable combination of **Photoshop Elements and Premiere Elements** which share a common Organizer to manage your collections. In this first session we'll look mostly at Photoshop Elements Organizer, not for Elements extensive photo editing that we have discussed earlier, but as a quick and easy tool to help prepare creative results easily.

On October 3rd, we'll concentrate on the Premiere Elements video editor including use of our September results.
