This open source freeware is truly portable. When you copy it to another location, it still works even though the files are in a different location than before.

The PortableApps.com Platform[™] is a full-featured portable software system that ties all your <u>portable</u> apps together and lets you build your own custom portable app suite for use on your USB drive, cloud drive, or local PC. Use it instead of your own collection of portable apps because

- 1. It's more convenient
- 2. The applications automatically update

Give the example of my slideshow presentation at the Photo SIG.

I needed VLC to show Indian Arm Final.avi Rather than search for it on the host computer, I used the portable version of VLC from my flash drive.

Use **Portable Irfanview** for another member's slide show because my version is configured to display all images full-screen.




