Photo Group Report by Ralph Sutter Notes from the Meeting of 09/10/2023

TOPIC: Close-up Photography

Ralph Sutter opened the meeting with close-up images taken using a Sony A7iv camera, Zeiss 4.0 24-70mm zoom lens and a Vello 2x teleconverter.

Using the 2x teleconverter made it difficult for the autofocus to produce sharp images. In his last image, Sutter switched to a Vello 3x converter, connecting the camera to a 26" monitor to aid in focusing. That produced a noticeably sharper image. Alan Raul shot a variety of closeup images with his Leica Q3.

He then took more closeup images using his Sony A7iv with a new Sony 70 - 200 F4.0 zoom lens. He then added a new Sony 2x teleconverter and shot more images.
