John Waller gave a presentation of the MagicJack <u>http://www.magicjack.com/9/index.asp</u>. It is a small, small box that plugs into any USB port. It provides telephone service over the Internet. The first year of service costs \$40, subsequent years are \$20 each. It offers free telephone service in the US and Canada. You also receive a phone number that people can use to call you, although it will not be free to them unless they use a MagicJack.

You can take the little box with you anywhere you go and use it. All it requires is a computer and a broadband connection. Due to issues with 911 it was recommended as a second line for your home to handle long distance calling. It supports call-waiting, voice mail, caller ID, 3-way conferences and it has a quiet mode that sends all calls straight to your voice mail if you do not want to be disturbed. Making calls with it was demonstrated as well as receiving calls.

Following John's presentation, **Ray Miklas** connected his laptop to the LCD projector and displayed his WinXP desk-top with the Windows Live Messenger <u>http://www.msgpluslive.net/download/</u> Yahoo! Messenger <u>http://messenger.yahoo.com/download/</u> and Skype <u>http://www.skype.com/download/skype/windows/</u>

Ray then logged on to each of the IMs (Instant Messenger) and proceeded to show various options available in each. Time was rushing on so the audience requested that he get into a greater detail of Skype. In Skype, Ray proceeded to dial his two contacts [without success] which showed to be on-line but to be "away" from their computers.

He then placed a call to Ben Hansen's cell phone, in the audience, connected, and proceeded to talk to him. Ray also called John Waller's home "Princes Phone" phone number at the demonstration table, right next to him.
