3 October, 2010 General Windows SIG Review by Ralph Sutter

Keyboard Shortcuts

Resize icons on desktop - Windows 7 and Vista:

On open desktop, hold down **CTRL** key and move scroll wheel up or down.

This also works to resize pages.

To scroll through Windows:

1. Hold down Shift key and move scroll wheel
2. Hold down ALT key and hit TAB
3. Control space between paragraphs by holding down the Shift key when you hit the Enter key (Demo)
4. Control what indents with the Tab key by holding down the CTRL key when you hit the Tab key (Demo)
5. Enlarge text by holding down the Shift key and rolling the Scroll Wheel
6. Hide all windows and show the desktop by holding down the Windows/Start key and pressing the M key (Command M-Mac)

Goals: Manipulate .pdf files with free software

To merge two .pdf documents into one

Rotate .pdf document and save that rotation

Use **Adolix Split/Merge PDF**: <http://www.adolix.com/split-merge-pdf/> to combine two or more pages into a single file

If you want to split large PDF files (bigger than 50 pages) and merge more than 5 pages into a single PDF then you must upgrade to the professional edition of **Adolix Split and Merge PDF**.

Demo product to split and merge .pdf files.

Tracker Software Products PDF-XChange Viewer: Has different capabilities than Adolix Split/Merge.

Document Manipulation: This is the only freeware product that I found that would not only rotate pages but save them in the rotated position. Other products rotated the pages while displaying them but wouldn't save them in that rotation.

From the **Document** menu, select **Rotate Pages/Direction**

In the freeware version, users cannot merge or split pages. Use **Adolix** for these functions.

Demo Other PDF-XChange Viewer Features

Insert Hyperlinks: Tools/Link Tools/Rectangle Link Tool – (Hyperlinks via Image Map, not by actual text)

Basic Tools

Use the Hand Tool for scrolling the page,

Use the Snapshot Tool to take a screen shot of one page

Use the Select Tool to cancel the other tools

Comment and Markup Tools (useful for drafts of documents that are reviewed by several persons)

Highlight Text Tool: to mark up text in yellow by default, other colors by selection. (*Demo on HardCopy*)

Cross-out Text Tool: to strike through text (*Demo on HardCopy*)

Underline Text Tool: to underline text (*Demo on HardCopy*)

Also by right-clicking a selected area-

Add a Note

Add a Link

Numerous Drawing Tools are also available

Insert Text

Use the **Typewriter Tool**: Demo Typewriter Tool to add text to the HardCopy

Use the **Hand Tool**: Overlay one text with another

October 3rd, 2010 Main Meeting Review by Don Jones

We looked at the beginning of a finished Premiere Elements, PRE, DVD video including a menu and animated text. Then we opened PRE and selected:

1. Two Photoshop Elements slide shows (.wmv) made from BBQ pictures as discussed in Sept.,
2. One "as shot" video clip (.mov) shot at the BBQ,
3. One still photo (.jpg) from the BBQ photos.

Each of these was placed in the Sceneline view, and then we changed to Timeline view. Sometimes, we need a placeholder video clip, so we demonstrated adding one at the beginning of our video (this option hides under the project tab). We added two title clips and placed them on the video 2 track, added transitions, and modified one to make our own version of a transition. We then moved to Share and looked at various output choices, especially small resolution Flash video used on Websites and handheld devices, and burning a DVD like the one demonstrated at the beginning. We rendered our video as a small Flash video to show this can be an important factor in the time video editing takes.

We switched back to editing options and added Scene/Chapter markers for DVD menus. A music (.mp3) file was chosen and added on the Audio 1 track. It was longer than our video, so we demonstrated splitting the clip and deleting part of it. We added two keyframes at and near the end of our video track and audio track. By simply dragging the end keyframes of the video opacity and audio volume, we made our own simple fade transitions at the end.

Under the DVD Menus tab, we selected a menu template and noted the automatic addition of scene selections using our markers, their names, and the first frame from each scene on its menu block. We added our short instant newsreel BBQ video from Sept. to the Main Menu block. Using the menu preview we looked at the final format to be seen on your home DVD player.

In the interest of time, I did not attempt to cover other PRE functions such as audio editing/mixing and controls in the Properties panel that we touched on in Sept. We ended by looking at the end of the DVD that we started with, noting how judicious editing and serendipitous photography can sometimes make something unique. Have fun!
