#### **Photo SIG Report** by Ralph Sutter

The Photo SIG met at 7:00 pm on November 17<sup>th</sup> in the home of Ralph Sutter. Ralph introduced two freeware programs. The first, **Karen's Printer Directory**, <u>www.karenware.com/progs/ptdirprn-setup.exe</u>, allows the user to either save or print the names of files that appear in a directory, choosing the level of detail included in the printout.

The second program, **Bulk Renamer**, <u>www.bulkrenameutility.co.uk/Download.php</u>, can be used to automatically modify multiple file names.

Ralph then showed a slide show of the art museum at Crystal Bridges in Rogers Arkansas using Irfanview.

Members who attended discussed the future focus of the Photo SIG. The consensus to concentrate on interesting photography, photo editing and photo display. Given the challenge of coming up with new topics for each meeting, we considered giving ourselves an assignment at the close of each meeting. One such assignment might be taking images of

water or images that show movement. Everyone would be tasked with bringing one or more images on the subject to the next meeting.

We also discussed having each member responsible for coming up with one program per year, either giving an informal presentation or showing a resource related to photography.

The group agreed to shift our meeting to the daytime and change the day of the meeting. Subsequent meeting will be on the second Sunday of the month beginning at 2:00 pm. They will take place at the home of Ralph Sutter. Directions and contact information are available here.

The next meeting will be on **December 14**th. The photo assignment is to bring images in which red is the dominant color.
