Notes from the meeting of 11/13/16; Panoramas

The meeting opened with the group viewing Pano | LA; a 6 minutes time lapse video of Los Angeles by night.

Humbled by that impressive work, our members proceeded to show their panoramic images of locations international and local. Many members used Microsoft's freeware program, <u>Image Composite Editor</u>. Some of us worked with digital cameras, both point and shoot as well as DSLR. Others opted for using the panoramic function of their smart phone. A few of us stitched images together using **Photoshop/Photoshop Elements**.

We compared the effectiveness of different programs to auto-complete those empty, jagged areas on the original panos that we chose not to crop. Several individuals shooting with digital cameras observed that they got better panos if they set the camera on manual exposure.
